



# Delaware State Forest Snowmobile Trails

**USER INFORMATION**

Most state forest roads are open for joint use by snowmobiles and licensed motor vehicles. Any road to be legally open for snowmobiling will be posted with the appropriate signs. Any snowmobile road (joint use) may be closed at any time to snowmobiles by the district forester. When there are other conflicting uses, such roads will be posted as "Closed to Snowmobiles." Snowmobiling is prohibited on any road or trail not designated for use—including posted and marked ski trails.

Operators must use extreme care, particularly on curves where oncoming traffic is not visible.

This map was current at the time of printing. However, local changes may be necessary. You should contact your local District Forester for any changes in this map. Local postings at road or trail intersections take precedence over any maps or dated material.

**NOTE:**  
All ATV and snowmobile trails, and also joint-use roads, can be used for hiking, cross-country skiing, and snow-shoeing.
